FIRST CONDITIONAL

The first conditional is a structure that we use when we want to talk about possibilities in the present or in the future. In this video you will learn how the first conditional is formed and when we use it.

In first conditional sentences, the structure is usually if + present simple, and will + infinitive

If you pay attention to the presentation, you will learn English.

Now, I am going to give you some other examples about the use

of the first conditional.

If I win the lottery, I will buy a new car.



If she goes to school, she will learn about different subjects.



If you study English, you will pass the TOEFL exam.

If he studies English, he will pass the TOEFL exam.

You will pass the TOEFL exam if you study English.

He will pass the TOEFL exam if he studies English.

If it rains tomorrow, we won't play football soccer.


We won't play football soccer if it rains tomorrow.
