
### ABSTRACT

**So** am I                                      I am **too**

We have worked in a project for 3 years.  
**So** has she                                      She has **too**

Miguel has been traveling to Pachuca  
**So** have we                                      We have **too**

My family will come back tomorrow  
**So** will Ana                                      Ana will **too**

They went to the gym las week  
**So** did Omar                                      Omar did **too**

# Examples with negative sentences

I *don't* go to school by taxi everyday.

**Neither** does Carlos  
Neither starts with N    Aux is affirmative    Subject

Carlos doesn't **either**  
Subject    Aux is negative    Either

I am not learning English online.

**Neither** am I

I am not **either**

We haven't worked in a project for 3 years.

**Neither** has she

She has **either**

Miguel hasn't been traveling to Pachuca

**Neither** have we

We have **either**

My family won't come back tomorrow

**Neither** will Ana

Ana will **either**

They went to the gym las week

**Neither** did Omar

Omar didn't **too**
