- •Notice that all subjects take the same conjugation of the verb.
- Regular verbs end in '-ed'.
   visit visited
   enjoy enjoyed
- •Irregular verbs have various forms and each verb needs to be learned.

see -saw think - thought

WAS-WERE (TO BE)	COULD (CAN)	REST OF THE VERBS
WAS → He, She, It WERE → I, You, We, They	She could open the door.	You graduated last year.
	She couldn't open the door.	You didn't graduate last year.
He was at home yesterday.		
He wasn't at home yesterday. Was He at home yesterday?	Could she open the door?	Did you graduate last year?
They were in my class. They weren't in my class. Were they in my class?

	You, we, they	were		in London.
-	I, he/she/it	was	not	there.
	You, we, they	were	not	happy.
?	Was	I, he/she/it		right?
	Were	You, we, they		late?

	Subject	Main verb		
+	I, You, He, She, It, We, You, They.	could		open the door.
-	I, You, He, She, It, We, You, They.	could	not	open the door.
?	Could	I, You, He, She, It, We, You, They.		open the door?
