Does **anyone** speak Nahuatl?

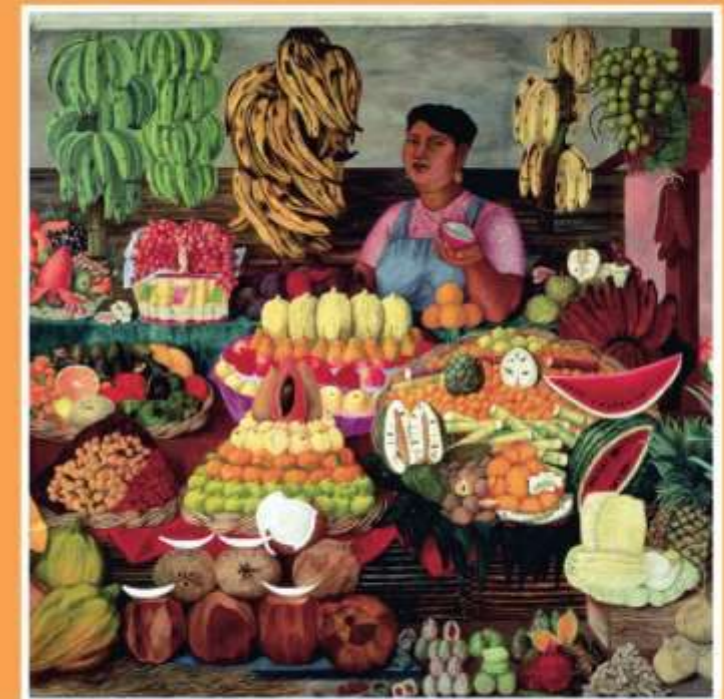
