Conditional sentences

Type 1



Conditional Type 1

- We use the 1st conditional when we feel there is a real possibility that something will happen.
- Conditional sentences consist of the **if – clause** and the **main clause**





Conditional type 1

Grammar structure

If-clause	Main clause
If + Present Simple <i>If you go to John's party,</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Future Will <i>you'll have a good time.</i>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Modal Verbs (may, might, can, must) <i>you must buy a present.</i>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Imperative <i>call me.</i>

Note: **Unless** can be used instead of **if ... not**
We'll play football tomorrow unless it rains.
