Conditional sentences Type 1









Conditional Type 1

- We use the 1st conditional when we feel there is a real possibility that something will happen.
- Conditional sentences consist of the if clause and the main clause












Conditional type 1 Grammar structure



Note: Unless can be used instead of if ... not We'll play football tomorrow unless it rains.
