A gerund is a verb in its "ing" form that functions as a noun and names an activity rather than a person or thing. You can use a gerund as the subject, the complement, or the object o a sentence (following the verb or after a preposition)

# INFINITIVE

**Infinitives** are the "to form" of the verbs. The infinitive form of "learn" is "to learn." You can also use an infinitive as the subject, the complement, or the object of a sentence.



| SUBJECT OF A SENTENCE  | OBJECT OF A SENTENCE | COMPLEMENT                           |
|------------------------|----------------------|--------------------------------------|
| To learn is important. | He wants to learn.   | The most important thing is to learn |




## FOLLOWING A PREPOSITION (GERUND ONLY)
