

Expressing likes and dislikes

When you want to express preferences, likes and dislikes, most of the time we use the simple present tense with the verbs "love", "enjoy", "like" to express likes and "hate", to express dislikes habitually.

These verbs are regularly accompanied by two types of words: nouns and verbs. Let's see the difference:



When love, enjoy, like and hate are used with nouns, The sentence has only one action, the feeling.

I love sport cars

She likes horror movies

We enjoy tropical music

They hate bananas

He doesn't like spinach

He doesn't enjoy parties

Mike doesn't love animals

Susan doesn't hate you



When love, enjoy, like and hate are used with **verbs** in infinitive form. It is used to refer to a particular moment or situation.

- She likes **to spend** time with her boyfriend
- I love **to watch** this movie
- They enjoy **to play** soccer all day.

When love, enjoy, like and hate are used with verbs in a **gerund** form. It is used to refer to situations in general, routinely or habitually events.

- I love **watching** this movie
- She likes **spending** time with her boyfriend
- They enjoy **playing** soccer all day
