PRESENT SIMPLE	PRESENT CONTINUOUS
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For habits or daily routines.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For actions happening now.
<i>I go to work every day.</i>	<i>I'm studying right now.</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For permanent states.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For actions happening around the time of speaking.
<i>He lives in Manchester</i>	<i>He is working late these days.</i>

Time Expressions

PRESENT SIMPLE

- Usually, Always, Often, etc.
- Every day / week, etc.
- In the morning / spring, etc.
- On Mondays / Monday morning, etc.
- At the weekend, At night, etc.
- Once / Twice / Three times, etc. a week / day, etc.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

- Now, At the moment, Today, These days, This week / year, etc.
- Tonight, Tomorrow, etc.
- Next week, year, etc.
